These notices shall satisfy two separate but related procedural requirements for activities to be undertaken by the City of Bristol.

REQUEST FOR RELEASE OF FUNDS

On or about February 9, 2026, the City of Bristol will submit a request to the Florida Department of Commerce for the release of Community Development Block Grant funds under Title I of the Housing and Community Development (HCD) Act of 1974, as amended, to undertake a project to replace waterlines, install fire hydrants, and replace water meters with drive-by water meters in the Neal Subdivision. The Scope of Work will include replacing approximately 12,670 linear feet of waterline, installing 9 new fire hydrants, and replacing water meters with drive-by water meters.

FINDING OF NO SIGNIFICANT IMPACT

The City of Bristol has determined that the project will have no significant impact on the human environment. Therefore, an Environmental Impact Statement under the National Environmental Policy Act of 1969 (NEPA) is not required. Additional project information is contained in the Environmental Review Record (ERR) file at City Hall at 12444 NW Virginia G. Weaver St., Bristol, FL 32321 and may be examined or copied on weekdays 8 A.M to 4 P.M.

PUBLIC COMMENTS

Any individual, group, or agency may submit written comments on the Environmental Review Record to City Hall at 12444 NW Virginia G. Weaver St., Bristol, FL 32321. Comments may also be submitted by email to the City Clerk, Chris Vowell at cvowell.cob@fairpoint.net. All comments must be received within 15 days following the publication date of this notice: by February 6, 2026. Comments will be considered prior to the City of Bristol requesting the release of funds. Comments should specify which notice they are addressing.

RELEASE OF FUNDS

The City of Bristol certifies to the Florida Department of Commerce and HUD that James Kersey in his capacity as Mayor consents to accept the jurisdiction of the Federal Courts if an action is brought to enforce responsibilities in relation to the environmental review process and that these responsibilities have been satisfied. The State's approval of the certification satisfies its responsibilities under NEPA and related laws and authorities and allows the City of Bristol to use the CDBG funds.

OBJECTIONS TO RELEASE OF FUNDS

The Florida Department of Commerce will accept objections to its release of funds and the City of Bristol certification for a period of fifteen days following the anticipated submission date or its actual receipt of the request (whichever is later) only if they are on one of the

following bases: (a) the certification was not executed by the Certifying Officer of the City of Bristol; (b) the City of Bristol has omitted a step or failed to make a decision or finding required by HUD regulations at 24 CFR part 58; (c) the grant recipient has committed funds or incurred costs not authorized by 24 CFR Part 58 before approval of a release of funds by the State; or (d) another Federal agency acting pursuant to 40 CFR Part 1504 has submitted a written finding that the project is unsatisfactory from the standpoint of environmental quality. Objections must be prepared and submitted in accordance with the required procedures at 24 CFR Part 58, Sec. 58.76 and shall be addressed to the Florida Department of Commerce, CDBG Program, MSC-400, 107 East Madison Street, Tallahassee, FL 32399-6508. Potential objectors should contact the City of Bristol to verify the actual last day of the objection period.



Project Description

The City of Bristol is seeking a Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) to fund critical waterline replacements and fire hydrant installations in the Neal Subdivision. The existing waterlines in this area are over 60 years old, leading to frequent issues such as breaks, low pressure, and poor water quality. The project aims to replace approximately 12,670 linear feet of waterline and install 9 new fire hydrants, along with drive-by water meters. This initiative will create more resilient infrastructure, ensuring a healthy and abundant water supply for residents, particularly those with low-to-moderate incomes, and improving fire protection.

The scope of work for the Neal Subdivision waterline replacement project:


- Replace approximately 12,670 linear feet of waterline.

- Install drive-by water meters.






Project Limits
